Huge support for calls to "Stand with us Women!"



Last month, the Leaders from the Tangentyere Women's Family Safety Group (TWFSG) called on people from around the county to "Stand with us Women" in a Women's Action March Against Family and Domestic Violence in Alice Springs. The Women's Action March was called to shine a light on the Aboriginal women, children and families who are living with, injured by or dying because of violence but who are too often invisible to the wider community. Over 300 people from around the country came out to support of the March and the call to #standwithuswomen.

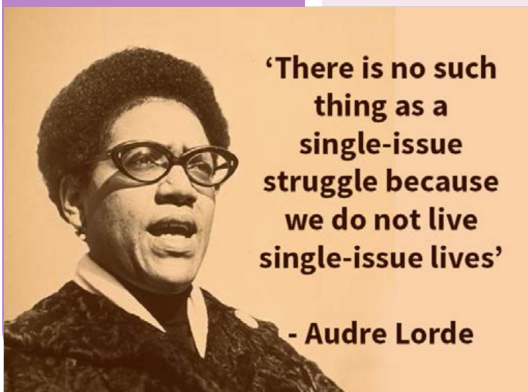
The March went from the Alice Springs Town Council Lawns and ended at the Alice Springs Court House Lawns where women who have experienced F&DV were honoured and remembered by the symbolic planting of flowers.

"We want to honour and remember them [women who have experienced F&DV] and make sure they are seen as real people not just statistics. We will be marching to the court house lawns where we want to plant symbolic flowers representing all these women and to make them real and visible." said the Co co-ordinator of the TWFSG

The Leaders from the TWFSG have said that they were overwhelmed by the support of the community and so happy to see so many people out showing support and "standing with us women".

Shirleen Campbell, Co co-ordinator of the Tangentyere Women's Family Safety Group had a message for people in all Communities and Families around the country;
